This program is based on the work of Charlotte Danielson who authored "A Framework for Teaching", and upon whose work the National Board Teacher Certification is also based. This program is being used around the country as the "platinum standard" in how teachers will mentor other teachers. For untenured teachers, the mentor is assigned until the mentee achieves tenure. It requires a minimum two year commitment on the part of both mentors and mentees, and it is a condition of employment at the NCSD until a person achieves tenure. We have also extended the requirement to cover teachers who, even though they may be tenured, have been displaced to new buildings and need help acclimating to a new grade level or subject area.

Pathwise consists of a kit with 7 events and is designed to be covered within a 2 year process. It is excellent for training all teachers to be more reflective practitioners and enhance their practice overall. It entails consistent meetings between mentor and mentees weekly throughout the school year, and all meetings are highly confidential. Mentors are required to go through extensive training before being certified to act as an

It is the policy of NCSD that every new teacher be assigned a Pathwise mentor who will work with them until they achieve tenure. We also assign a mentor for two years to our teachers who have joined us having already achieved tenure in another district or who are not new to our district but have changed buildings, grade levels, or teaching discipline.

Besides working the Pathwise program with you, your mentor's job will be to help you acclimate to the Novi Community School District. He/ she will show you how to navigate KALPA, which is our district professional staff development (PSD) management program, and help you manage your PSD requirements. They will also assist you with your required Individual Development Plan (IDP) and help you with general issues that arise with being new to a school district. It is an important relationship for your growth here at NCSD, and it is designed to help you become the most successful educator you can be.

Full-time attendance is required to become a certified mentor. Mentors receive: a \$200 stipend, 30 hours in KALPA, and up to 3 SB-CEUs per


